# Join the Faculty of GRAD Academy Memphis in 2017-18 Parent/Family Engagement and At Risk Services Coordinator

GRAD Academy Memphis is part of the Achievement School District (ASD) of Tennessee, a statewide district that seeks to close the opportunity gaps long persistent in Tennessee's public education by 2025. GRAD Academy opened in 2013-2014 with a 9th grade class and continued adding a grade each year through 2016-17, when it became 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade high school.

Instruction at GRAD Academy Memphis is based on the <u>New Tech Network</u> model, a project-based learning approach supported by a comprehensive technology platform. Through New Tech, GRAD Academy faculty are part of a nationwide network of educators who are demonstrating that students can meet challenging academic standards through hands-on engagement with meaningful, locally relevant questions and problems.

We seek faculty who are excited to take on this ambitious instructional model, to realize GRAD's mission of disrupting inequities in public education to ensure that all our scholars have the knowledge, skills and habits of mind to become responsible citizens and stewards of our future.

### Job Summary:

The Director of Parent/Family Engagement and at Risk Services works closely with the school staff, parents and community to create, support, and strengthen strategies and activities for parents with students at risk with an emphasis on the social, emotional and academic success of their children based on a two tiered system:

## Tier I

Spearhead school wide Tier I initiatives in collaboration with community partners and volunteers around data specific areas such as chronic absenteeism, literacy rates, socio-economic behavior, and life skills

#### Tier II

Identify special populations to help eliminate non-academic barriers to education such as homelessness, abuse/neglect, food insecurities, and/or behavioral diagnosis

# Job expectations:

The Director of Parent/Family Engagement and At Risk Services serves as the liaison between school and parents, relaying the needs of one to the other; educates teachers and staff on how to communicate and work effectively with parents as equal partners; advises and trains parents on how to address issues with the leadership staff in school meetings; serves as a school-based intermediary contact for concerns and comments made by parents and community members; provides referrals to community-based services for families; expands opportunities for continued learning, voluntary community service and civic participation; develops community collaborations; promotes sharing of power with parents as decision-makers; helps parents understand the educational system so they can become better advocates for their children's education; maintains parent resource center. Additionally, the Director of Parent/Family Engagement and At Risk Services will:

- Identify, initiate, and deepen relationships with various community stakeholders and parents
- Expand and develop new partnership opportunities which align with school's mission and purpose
- Schedule, implement, and create community-based programs, partnerships, and other engagement initiatives
- Recruit and support mentor and volunteer program
- Facilitate wrap around services to students and families. Serve as liaison between student/families and social service agencies (Anaya, Intercepts, DCS, Alliance, Lakeside, DJJ, CSA)
- Work with Social Workers, Community Partner Staff (CIS, Agape, Youth Villages) to develop pathways toward individual student success
- Monitor the referral process and update school leaders on progress and services provided

- -Self-motivated leader who can work independently as well as part of team
- -Strong interpersonal skills Knowledge of family engagement research and literature

- -Ability to host parent meetings off school sites and in the local community and/or neighborhoods
- -Experience with developing collaborative partners and building relationships with constituents in the community
